Since our last AGM, our world has been transformed in ways none of us would ever have conceived! Our community now in 'lock down' to prevent the spread of the Coronavirus, with our churches, non-essential businesses, schools and leisure facilities all closed and freedom of movement restricted- limited to essential shopping and one period of outdoor exercise per day!

When new words such as key workers, social distancing and social isolation, have become absorbed into our everyday language and experience, I feel very grateful for our shared Christian faith and network of church and Mothers' Union friendships and relationships. These relationships built together with our common understanding of worship and prayer, do strengthen and sustain us and give us hope for the future. As I prepare these reports for the AGM, I reflect with gratitude on all the experiences shared together over the last year.

Our last AGM was held at Wishaw church hall with thanks to our Rector, Christine Crawford and Florence for their help in facilitating this meeting and with refreshments afterwards.

The work of our branch progressed with an excellent series of monthly meetings from April till June. Deborah Edgar from Alzheimer Scotland gave us a wonderfully enlightening and

interactive talk on 'how to live well with Dementia', in April 2019. We learnt over 90,000 people are living with dementia in Scotland and took away '5 key messages about Dementia'.

Alzheimer's Scotland believes 'nobody should face dementia alone'. Alzheimer's Scotland have a 24



In May 2019, Agnes Cleland from Elim Befriending Service (EBS) Motherwell, explained how their service, (launched in 2015) aims to provide a befriending service for anyone aged 18 years and over. 'Befriending is an act to become a friend to someone, especially when they are in need of help and support'. The aim is to provide respite for carers and help service users become more independent and self-reliant in community. (www.ebsmotherwell.org.uk)

Mr Allan Kirkwood, Volunteer Development Manager for Diabetes Scotland gave an excellent talk to our branch in June 2019, when he explained the work of the organisation, much like the Mothers Union, relies entirely on public donations to be able to provide their services. Diabetes Scotland, in addition to providing support for Diabetic sufferers to live well, petition for improved services at governmental level and raise awareness of patients' needs with Healthcare managers and donate money for research. Our MU branch recognise: 'Diabetes presents a serious health challenge for Scotland'.



In May 2019 our branch continued to work in partnership with other agencies. We worked with our Rector Rev Richard Kilgour to partner with Active Schools, Joe Wilson Table Tennis and VANL to launch a series of new Community Children's' Table Tennis sessions for boys and girls aged 8-12.

These sessions were held weekly at Holy Trinity church hall. Colette Martin from Joe Wilson Table Tennis delivered coaching, the Rector set up and put away the Table Tennis tables and Hazel O'Hara and Katharine Kilgour worked as volunteer adult helpers to support each session. The chart above shows the gender ratio of attendance over the initial twelve sessions last year. We continued to operate weekly sessions until the week before Christmas and into the New Year. Having piloted children's sessions last year, the plan this year was to extend the opportunity to try Table Tennis to offer adult sessions particularly for the over 50 age group.

In June (4.6.19) representatives from Holy Trinity Mothers Union, Katharine Kilgour, Branch Leader and Hazel O'Hara attended the VANL conference held at Freedom Church Cumbernauld with Rector Reverend Richard Kilgour and Joe Wilson Table Tennis coach, Colette Martin. Our branch took the Diocesan MU banner and held a plant stall at the event. The day began with an opportunity to learn about the 'Plan for



North Lanarkshire' introduced by Des Murray the Council Chief Executive. Workshops and speakers shared information on existing and developing programmes in the community.

On 10 August 2019 our Branch hosted a very successful Diocesan Mothers' Union Festival, facilitated with support from our Rector. The service was well attended. Guests included, eco-congregation Chaplain Rev David Coleman, and grateful thanks were given to Mr Julian Hodgson who played the organ for the occasion, and all who joined in the choir, and worked to clean and decorate the church specially for the occasion.



Mrs Christine Crawford, and Miss Jennifer Gray, carried our branch banners and during the festival service Mrs Jill Cameron, the Diocesan MU President, presented Mrs Olga Harding with a 40 year certificate of long service to Mothers' Union.

There was agreement at the meeting to support a new initiative launched on 23.02.2020, of a twelve week series of sport and activity for 14-18 year olds at Firpark on Sundays from 4-7pm.
